# **COURSE DATES**

Please note that the dates given below are when you should arrive in and depart from Russia. Please book your flights for those dates. The courses will start on the following day. You should not plan to arrive even one day earlier, as your visa is likely to start on the dates given below. The dates are for all courses in all of the RLUS centres.

It is very important that you arrive on the date stated. If you fail to do this, you will miss the initial briefing. This will give you essential information about life in Russia and help to avoid problems with Russian bureaucracy. You will also miss the initial test to divide you into groups.

## **FLIGHTS**

#### **FLYING TO MOSCOW**

If you are studying in Moscow, Kazan, Tver or Yaroslavl, you should fly to Moscow Domodedovo airport. The recommended flights are:

London -- Moscow BA233

Moscow - London BA232

#### FLYING TO ST PETERSBURG

If you are studying in St Petersburg, you should fly to St Petersburg Pulkovo airport. The recommended flights are:

## London – St Petersburg BA878 St Petersburg – London BA879

If you arrive on these flights, you will be met and taken free of charge to your accommodation. If you are studying in Yaroslavl, you will be met and taken by bus to Yaroslavl. Kazan students will be met and taken by overnight train to Kazan. If you book flights that arrive before the BA flight and are prepared to wait for the BA flight, you can also be met and taken to your accommodation.

If you have arranged your own accommodation, you will have to make your own way to your accommodation at your own expense, even if you are on one of the above flights.

You can book the BA flights and find the current times on the BA website: www.ba.com.

If you arrive after the BA flight, you will have to make your own way to your accommodation. If want a taxi arranged for you, please contact the relevant RLUS representative. Contact details are on the *Contact* page of the website. You will have to pay for the cost of the taxi. The RLUS representative will let you know the cost.

If you plan to make own way to your accommodation, please contact the RLUS representative a few days before your arrival to find out where you will be staying. We do not normally let you have the address of your homestay accommodation in advance for reasons explained in the *Accommodation* page of the website in the link *Accommodation arranged for you*.

If you are flying in to Moscow, please note that the BA flight arrives at Moscow Domodedovo airport. Some flights, including Aeroflot, which is currently the only other airline to operate direct flights to Moscow, arrive at the other main international airport Sheremetevo. This is a very long way from Domodedovo airport and you will have to make your own way to your accommodation or arrange for a taxi. St Petersburg has only one airport: Pulkovo.
